From December 2022, we began accepting submissions on our Minimum feed-in tariff review 2023-24 via Engage Victoria (www.engage.vic.gov.au). On this website, people were given the opportunity to send us a response to a set of questions we provided.

What parts of our proposed methodology for setting the minimum single and time-varying feed-in tariff rates do you consider are appropriate?

The holistic consultation around single and time varying FIT is appropriate.

What parts of our proposed methodology should we change?

Retailers are not compelled to offer a ToU Feed-In Tariff, even when they offer a Retail ToU tariff for electricity consumption. This creates disappointing consumer outcomes and causes confusion to consumers, and small business.

For our overall methodology, or parts of it, what alternative methodologies should we consider?

All retailers should be required to offer at least a single ToU offer, in parallel to the FiT Flat Rate Export minimum. Alternatively, Retailers already selling products with ToU pricing should give the consumers the option to opt-in to ToU FiT.
