Hi,

As a retail customer with Solar panels the proposed reducing in feed tariffs seems reasonable.

That said - when my retailer - Tango determined that I had roof top solar the costs for kw consumed nearly doubled compared to if I did not have roof top solar.

So my question is as part of the overall Energy Pricing review I do believe that retailers should reduce the kw per hour charge that retailers charge their customers as a large benefit of having roof top solar has been substantially reduced.

There will become a point where retail customers will install batteries and disconnect from the grid - due to daily supply charges that for me are about \$1.2 per day - if my roof top solar is not valued as part of the transition to net zero then why should I give it away for nearly free? Who does that in business?

Anyway I do think the charges that retailers charge per kwh to a retail consumer needs to be reviewed in conjunction with the reduction in the feed in tariff.
